Transform your career - graduate with two masters degrees in two years by completing a Master of International Relations in combination with a Master of International Law.

The University of Western Australia, through the cross-disciplinary expertise of the Faculty of Law and the Faculty of Arts, is providing a one of a kind opportunity for graduates to attain two sought after qualifications through the combined Master of International Relations and Master of International Law.

Suited to both legal and non-legal professionals, students acquire both qualifications in a shorter time frame than if undertaking them individually. The program begins with the Master of International Relations course and upon successful completion of 48 credit points, students gain entry to the Master of International Law.

The program includes 8-10 units in the Master of International Relations and 6-8 units in the Master of International Law, students are encouraged to complete the International Relations units in their first year.

Master of International Relations

The Master of International Relations is a professionally-oriented postgraduate degree that equips graduates with the advanced academic training and essential practical skills required to gain employment and operate effectively in a range of careers that require expertise about our complex, dynamic and globalised world.

Course structure

If completing as two separate degrees consecutively	Master of International Relations 1.5 years (12 units)	Master of International Law 1 year (8 units)
If completing as combined degree concurrently	Graduate in 2 years (6 months early) (Comprises of 8-10 International Relations units and 6-8 International Law units)

Key dates

Domestic students: Applications for February intake open in September and close late January. Applications for July intake open in April and close early July.
